2. A curated digital portfolio of ten (10) works that best represents your artistic work. Each image will include: Title, Date, Dimensions, and Media.
3. An artist statement.
4. A copy of your fall 2025 class list and a transcript including major, completed classes and grades.
5. Letter(s) of recommendation from your art professor(s) would be helpful, but are not required.
